UN International Day of Peace - Tuesday 21 September 2021 It is the first day of the General Debate of the 76th session of the UN General Assembly.

Celebration of the UN International Day of Peace at Alfred Nobel House, Karlskoga, Sweden.

The United Nations established the International Day of Peace 40 years ago in 1981. The theme in 2021 is "Recovering better for an equitable and sustainable world". It will be celebrated at Alfred Nobel House in Karlskoga, Sweden, in the Sustainable Gastronomy exhibition, with a presentation of the following books:

- Canada Peace by Chocolate, Hadhad family migrants from Syria to Canada, Jon Tattrie (Gooselane 2021)
- India-Pakistan Flavours of the Frontier, Pushpa Kumari Bagai (Markings 2014) Comfort through cuisine for migrants of the Indo-Pak Partition
- Middle East On the Hummus Route, Ariel Rosenthal, Orly Pell Bronshtein, Dan Alexander (Magica 2020) A Palestinian, a Lebanese and an Israeli walk into a bar...
- South Pacific Me'a Kai, Robert Oliver, the cookbook that started the Pacific Island Food Revolution, changing food systems (Random House NZ 2010)
